FRENCH III SYLLABUS

Note: If chapters 13 and 14 in the French II book are not completed, the information will be covered in chapters one and two of the French III book. See French 2 syllabus for chapter 12 and 13 descriptions.

At the start of the year, French III will review irregular verbs in present tense, formation of regular er, ir, and re verbs, and the passé compose of regular verbs, irregular verbs, and verbs that use avoir as the auxiliary verb. They will also learn the present and passé compose of reflexive verbs before starting chapter 1 or chapter 3.

Chapter 3 – The students will talk about computers, e-mails, faxes, the Internet, and telephones. They will learn the imperfect tense to talk about continuous actions in the past.

Chapter 4 – The students will discuss air and train travel, describe past events, identify cities, countries, and continents, and discuss the odl and modern trains in France.

Chapter 5 – The students will talk about using the services of the bank, use words and expressions related the postal system, give more information in one sentence, refer to things and people already mentioned, tell what people do for one another, make negative statements, and talk about teen spending habits.

Chapter 6 – The students will discuss foods and food preparation, describe future events, refer to people and things already mentioned, tell what others do for people, and discuss the cuisine of the French provinces.

Chapter 7 – The students discuss cars and driving, give directions on the road, talk about what would happen under certain conditions, describe future events, refer to something already mentioned, talk about driving and highways in France.
